

### The Success in Louisiana.

We have a general account of the progress of Gen. Banks up the Bayou Teche, toward Alexandria on the Red river, and a list of the wounded in the 13th and 25th Conn. regiments in the engagements up to the 17th. Our army moved in two divisions, one from Berwick City, under Gen. Banks, and the other from Brashear City, under Gen. Grover, up the Grand Lake on transports, till they reached Indian (or Irish) Bend on the Teche. Here 10,000 rebels, under Dick Taylor (son of Old Zach) were encountered and defeated, but our two regiments met considerable loss. The 25th was first in the fight, and the 13th is reported to have distinguished itself by a gallant charge through a plowed field and over two fences.

The expedition is very successful and was progressing finely at last dates. The rebels, secure heretofore in their swamps and bayous, are routed out completely, and they are retreating disorganized. Some 1500 prisoners have been taken, a large amount of supplies captured, and about a dozen rebel steamers destroyed, one a fine gunboat clad with railroad iron. It is also supposed that the expedition has broken up a well laid plan for invading New Orleans. There is a report, via Memphis, that Banks had reached Point Coupee, which is on the Mississippi, opposite Bayou Sara. It is more probable, from our advices, that he has kept on his course toward the Red River, to strike it at Alexandria.
